

President's Report

As 2014 draws to a close I would like to reflect on what I consider a very successful season for Manning Valley Hockey. Hockey NSW reforms that have been imposed on us has meant that we our association and Gloucester Hockey Association were required to amalgamate in 2015. As a result we have been consulting with each other so that it will be an amalgamation that is of benefit to both our associations. This amalgamation has required a change in our constitution to allow for representation of Gloucester Hockey on the Associations Board of Management. The Hockey Reform has also enforced many changes in the areas of governance, participation and development .We have been most fortunate that our members have been able to work together to overcome the challenges before us.

I would like to congratulate those teams that made it through the grand finals. The visit from the Hockeyroo's Captain Madonna Blyth and 2RE broadcasting at the clubhouse I feel was a great addition to the Grand Final Program and helped to lift our profile in the community.

I would also offer my appreciation to all those people that put time in into our representative teams. We had many successes at both open and indoor championships. The selection of members for state squads is a reflection on the great efforts of the players and their supporters. The employment of a Regional Coaching Coordinator by HNSW and jointly funded by them and MVHA is a great initiative and should be great for Hockey in the area.

Hockey not only a great game but also must be a viable business. We are most fortunate that Doug Davidson agreed to accept the position of Treasurer of our Association . His expertise was greatly appreciated in our dealings with the Australian Taxation Office .

A challenge we face as a sport in the Manning area is to continue to "grow" of our game. In 2014 there was an increase in participation of one hundred players across both Junior and Senior competitions.

I would like to thank both the members and our club administrators for accepting the challenges in the implementation of the new registration system. It had its problems but with time and patience we will overcome many of the issues regarding the new system.

It is hoped that with the implementation of the Regional Coaching Co- Ordinator (RCC), the Athlete Acceleration Program (AAP)(which is a pathway for our manning valley junior players to make state representative teams in the age groups of under 16 and under 18 age group), the Centre of Development (COD) (which last year focused on the under 13 and 15) and the Elite Coaching Squads (conducted by our Coaching Director on Thursday nights with the assistance from our members) has provided many opportunities for our players to develop their game and be given an opportunity to gain representative selection. For 2015 our game business plan intends to focus on including the under 7 and under 9 age groups in the Centre of Development.

We are very fortunate that we have many volunteers in our hockey community that enable the game to function and flourish. I would like to offer you my sincere appreciation for your dedication to our sport without who the success achieved at the carnivals we have hosted, the conducting of our competitions, the functioning of the canteen , the development of facilities (for example the work done on the new change room)and other activities would not be achieved.

I would also like to thank my board for their professionalism, advice and ability to focus on what is the best for our sport.

In closing, the outlook and opportunities for our sport remain overwhelming positive. We have a collective group with a passion for the game along with a dedicated and skilled army of volunteers that should make us proud.

This year saw the Clubhouse in full utilisation again with Manning Hosting U13 Boys Championships. \$20,000 was spent in upgrading the Kitchen and Bar area, with the introduction of the new prep fridge, freezer, mini deep fryer and cool room.

The Prep Fridge has made for a more efficient production of food and also ensuring that the Food Safety Act requirements are met.

The large double door Freezer which will hold all of our frozen goods (No trips down to the Store Room to bring food up) and enables better stock control.

The Cool room has proved to be a godsend allowing us to store large quantities of alcohol and soft drink upstairs, also show cases what drinks we have available.

The mini deep fryer was purchased to cook the Chicken Schnitzels and Chicken Chippies to free up the main Deep Fryer to cook chips only, this as seen a huge increase in the sale of Chicken burgers as the end product being produced was of high quality and customers not receiving burnt offerings or under cooked chicken burgers.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Gloria Smith, Dot Stewart and Cathy Groth for their time and camaraderie on the canteen every Saturday during the season.

On a disappointing note had trouble getting volunteers for Bar Duties. Unfortunately left to the same people all the time and lots of times the Board of Management Duty Officer had to fill in the gaps. Happy to have any feedback on this, i.e. are the time slots too long. The Board of Management are currently applying for a different licence – an "On Premises Licence" instead of a Limited Licence (52 events per calendar year), as we came up short this season, if successful will be able to be open 7 days a week, which will enable the bar to be opened for Catch Up Games, Club functions during the week days. i.e. Clubs might like to have a BBQ and drinks after training.

Noted that persons with Certificate in Food Handling Course (Certificate 2 Hospitality and Follow Workplace Hygiene Procedures) will expire this year and will need to be renewed.

Peter and Larry have completed the 2nd Change Room downstairs (Now have two separate one for the men and one for the ladies). Once again they have done an excellent job. Unfortunately have had a couple instances of vandalism down stairs which is disappointing to have the hard work that volunteers put in only to have it destroyed or damaged. A huge thank you to Peter Cubbin, Larry Mercer and Kevin Haig for their continued work that they carry out. Thanks a lot guys.

I would like to thank Tim Le Strange for helping me with the cleaning and filtering of the Deep Fryer every Thursday over the season.



Most Valuable Player of the Tournament was Steve Parvin with Rhett Patterson only two points behind.





Sam Mudford, winner of the Manning River Times-Greater Taree City Council-Ken McDonald Memorial Sportstar of the Year.

AUSTRALIAN All Schools representative Sam Mudford became the seventh hockey player to win the Manning River Times-Greater Taree-Ken McDonald Sportstar of the Year award - or the 'Kenny Mac' as it is known.

Sam, 15, follows Robyn Fernley (1975), Kristen and Julie Towers (1990), Brooke Morrison (1995), Kate Harris (1987) and Maddison Rosser (2011). Hockey has provided the most winners of the award that was inaugurated by Ken McDonald in 1960, although Sam is the first male hockey player to get his name on the trophy.

Sam was named in the Australian side to tour South Africa next June following the Australian All School Championships held in Perth. He was a member of the NSW side that dominated the championship until the final when beaten by Queensland.

Sam was the unanimous choice of the judging panel consisting of Hugh McCrindle OAM (chairman), mayor Paul Hogan, GTCC general manager Ron Posselt, Narelle Salmon, Craig Martin and Mick McDonald.

There were six candidates for the award, Sam, dragon boat racers Sean Page and Sam Thomson, equestrian Sui Watts, swimmer Brock Van Kampen and motor cyclist Jack Hyde.

"It was a diverse field," Mr McCrindle said of the finalists.

"All the finalists had outstanding credentials and it was a tough decision."

Mr McCrindle noted that three of the past hockey winners - Robyn Fernley, the Towers twins and Brooke Morrison went onto play for the Hockeyroos. Fernley (now Leggatt) captained Australia at the 1984 Olympic Games while Julie Towers was a member of Australia's gold medal winning team at the 2000 Sydney Olympics.

"Ths Manning has produced some wonderful hockey players," Mr McCrindle said.

"Sam is continuing that tradition."

Sam thanked his parents, Dave and Fran, for their support.

"They take me around everywhere," he said, while also congratulating the other finalists.

Sam is a member of the Sharks side in the Manning A-grade competition while he also plays in the Newcastle Premier League.
