Presidents Report 2017 Season – Manning Valley Hockey Association (MVHA)

My first year as President has been an interesting and, at times, frustrating and tiring but immensely fulfilling role. I have enjoyed the support and guidance from all my fellow Board members throughout the season.

MVHA have experienced many new and exciting developments this year. I took this role on with the funding for the new clubhouse extension and 3rd turf already in place. We turned the soil early in the season on the project and now have a wonderful facility that we can enjoy for years to come. I would sincerely like to thank the tireless effort of our members, donating goods and/ or their time and energy and have gone above and beyond in helping the clubhouse get to this stage.

The new clubhouse extension was always a shared space. MVHA has entered a MoU with Manning Valley Cycle Club about the ongoing use of the shared space specially to enable large tournaments and meets in the future, further helping to raise the profile of both sports.

As with most big builds we experienced unplanned setbacks and have gone over budget due to some unforeseen extra costs. The Board have had many discussions on how we can absorb the impact and have now got a firm action plan partnering with Mid Coast Council. The good news for our members is that there will be no cost or levy placed on members fees from the association in 2018.

The third turf is just awaiting the surface to be laid and then it will be ready for action this season. Other highlights and achievements from the 2017 season:

- Growth in our association with 841 members.
- We had Association supported gala days at the beginning of the season help grow our junior ranks with strong numbers in U12 age groups.
- A mixed U17/18 competition running on Tuesday nights
- A new RCC in Ben Hanlan supporting our Association and promoting hockey. Ben worked tirelessly and always made himself available to every club and the association for junior events.
- Signed an official sponsorship agreement with Just Hockey, providing access to hockey goods for all our members.
- Introduced the HNSW sponsored Revolutionise registration system which will continue into 2018 and beyond.
- Introduced a family discount to help alleviate the cost of hockey to our families.
- Established amalgamated senior playing rules in the association, to be introduced in the 2018 season.
- Utilised the hockey centre in the off season by joining with Manning Futsal in an agreement.
- Hosted the under 15 boys State Championships. All our 2017 junior and senior representative teams
 performed well and were fantastic ambassadors for MVHA, with many players being selected in State and
 Australian sides.
- Signed an agreement with Taree PCYC to streamline access of indoor teams to use their facilities for training.
- Revamped the Representative Manual and established a very active Representative Committee as we have seen by the preliminary work done by the committee so far.
- Established a Junior Development Committee to work with the Junior match committee to further help and suggest projects to improve junior player involvement in hockey.
- Updating the webpage making it modern and more user friendly for our members.
- Developed and submitted a 3-year strategic plan to HNSW and locking in another 3-year deal for tournaments till 2021.
- Sadly in 2017 we also lost members of our extended hockey family. Vale Kay Klump a stalwart of MVHA.

What we are doing in 2018:

- Completing the third turf.
- A 2018 season planner calendar was released to all club's mid-way through 2017 to facilitate better
 organisation and planning at the start and during the season. This plan includes more gala days and the
 Kookaburra 8's.
- We are continuing to work with our RCC, Ben to try and raise the profile of hockey and increase participation in the Manning Valley, especially with juniors.
- Help our clubs utilise the \$100 rebate for all school age children offered by the NSW Government

- HNSW has gazetted 2018 to be the Year of respecting officials. In 2017 MVHA ran two very successful antiviolence campaigns with Shoosh for Kids promoting positive behaviour in junior sport by everyone and Lace Up a campaign raising awareness of social violence. We will again look at supporting these behaviours at
- Hosting U13's girls NSW Championships.
- Continue to build on partnerships with PCYC, MVCC and Futsal to utilise our new centre and create more opportunities for MVHA in the future.
- Introducing EFTPOS at the canteen and bar.
- Playing under standardised senior rules across men's and women's competitions.

Lastly, thank you to my fellow Board members, the club executives and all the members and volunteers for making my first year as President a busy, productive and wonderful experience. I look forward to 2018 being another season of growth and evolution in hockey and our competitions. Deb Monck







MANNING Hockey will host two major state championships in 2019 and 2020.

The NSW under 18 women's titles will be here next year while the Northern Women's Half State Masters Championships are scheduled for 2020.

This has been confirmed by Hockey NSW. The under 18 titles will be held from May 10 to 12 in 2019.

"The northern masters is one of the biggest events we've held here in terms of player participation," Manning Hockey president Debbie Monck said.

Teams will come from Sydney to the Queensland border.

"We've held it here before but 2020 will be the first time we've had the three turf fields in use."

In past years the association has had to use grass fields as well as the synthetic surface grass fields for the masters. This will probably be the case in 2020, depending on the number of sides involved.

However, having three turf fields will be a huge boost if wet weather intervenes.

"We had the half State here a few years ago and the weather was atrocious," Debbie recalled.

"We only had the two turf fields then and we couldn't play on the grass because of the rain. Hockey NSW had

a potential problem, Debbie said the third turf field would mean games wouldn't have to be as drastically cut back if rain rules out the grass fields.

"Players will get more value for their money," she said. Debbie said the under 18 titles next year will provide some top class hockey – probably the best seen here.

Earlier this year the association hosted the State under 13 girl's championship. This attracted 43 sides and was played over three days, employing the three synthetic surface fields for the first time.

"The feedback we got from Hockey NSW and from people here for the championship was really positive," Debbie said.

Debbie confirmed Manning will be represented at the under 18 titles next year. However, at this stage she isn't sure how many sides will be here.

"We should have a strong squad, we have a lot of good young players in that age division," she said.

"That was confirmed with Taree High's win at the State CHS championship last week."

Meanwhile six Manning players head to Western Australia this week with NSW teams to contest the Australian Women's Masters Championship. They are Kerrie Davy, Paula Smith, Kristy Aldridge, Melissa Mendham, Linda Ferguson
