Attachment e: UMPIRE DIRECTOR'S REPORT2013

Two new Rules were introduced at the start of the 2013 season, which were adopted by MVHA.

The following Information was distributed to all Sub Committees and Clubs so they could disseminate the information to all players and in particular to their nominated umpires.

These Included New Rules from Hockey Australia Directions to Umpires Umpire Briefing Notes (a 31 page document from Hockey Australia) Hard copies of these documents were also kept in the clubhouse.

Once Again there was great difficulty in organizing a Umpires Delegates Committee Meeting. Meeting held in April - consensus was that we abide by the guidelines from 2012, these being:-

Attributes of Umpiring – being pro active and communicating with co-umpire, be mobile, be correctly attired and be more diligent on deliberate fouls, use appropriate penalties

The Dress Code for umpires to remain the same as for 2012, FLURO shirts, Black Trousers, skirt, shorts and suitable footwear Reimbursement for travel for umpires to remain at \$20, Junior games \$10

Clubs to supply their umpires with FLURO shirts or obtain from clubhouse

Clubs must be responsible for supplying QUALITY umpires for the games

Concern expressed about the number of games that some umpires are doing in a round. This needs to be monitored more closely by Sub Committees and Clubs

Concern over the quality of umpiring or performance of an umpire is to be brought before the club supplying the umpire.

The president took measures to address clubs at the Presidents and Secretaries meeting expressing concern about the conduct of spectators and abuse directed towards umpires after an issue mid season.

Codes Of Conduct were then distributed in order to hopefully improve the attitude and behaviour of all.

A reminder that NEW Judiciary Guidelines were adopted by MVHA in November 2011.

New Rule Books were made available to all.

Umpire Seminars were held on the 1st July and over 80 took advantage of hearing from a previous International Umpire, Peri Buckley, who delivered 2 very enlightening talks on umpiring and control of the game. My thanks to Peri for making herself available to the BOM for arranging the night and to Lynne Turner for organizing supper.

Of particular note was the positioning and signaling of umpires – and the following was made loud and clear.

"TO DISCOURAGE UMPIRES FROM SIGNALLING IN THE AREAS NOT DIRECTLY UNDER THEIR CONTROL, ESPECIALLY THE OPPOSING CIRCLE."

The trend for umpires to do this is OLD STYLE umpiring coaching and at Junior Tournaments all umpires were reminded of this. The ONLY time you assist the other umpire is if they ask, make eye contact or ask you for a ruling. It is OK to do a little signal so others do not see, but now they are told to umpire with their hands beside their body and DON'T repeat the other umpires signal.

Umpires are again reminded to not tolerate inappropriate behaviour, offensive language and abuse to umpires. A consistent and assertive approach is necessary to eliminate this from our game.

During the season there were 3 Judiciary hearings.

Thanks to members of the panels for their time and expertise in dealing with these.

Many thanks to all those who dedicated their services to the teams throughout the season as umpires and for the commitment they showed in their weekly duties.

I congratulate and applaud all the appointed umpires in the final series for their appointments and their dedication to the tasks. It was very rewarding and professional to see all apply themselves and present themselves in correct and appropriate attire.

I would like to congratulate to BOM for the organization in supplying and appointing Umpires outside our competition for the duty of officiating at the Grand Final games for Div 1 and 2 men and women.

There were many comments re their appointment but how rewarding for all to experience such quality and demonstrate to all how umpires work together and handle games so efficiently without dissent.

Unfortunately the Umpire Of The Year Award was not presented this year, as Sub Committees did not nominate anyone. A pity, as there were several who would have been worthy recipients.

In 2014 The Umpires Director will be asking all Sub Committees to update their list of umpires. This will be completed on a special form, collated, and hopefully will make the allocation of umpires an easier task

Finally thank you to all who assisted me in my Role this year and to the BOM for assuming my duties whilst I was away with Australian and NSW commitments.

Attachment f: Coaching Directors Report

After a long, long season we need to take the time to reflect and try to look at all of the positives that we achieved this year. As we know reform is coming and by 2015 Manning Valley Hockey needs to be up to date in terms of a accreditation, playing rules, etc, This year we held our first level one coaching courses. This course was conducted through Burleigh Coaching, and Nate Butterfield. The exciting part for me personally was the large number of our club and representative coaches that attended the courses. I would like to thank those members that attended the courses held by the MVHA.

Hopefully the grant we received to purchase computes/laptop will make the online part of the certification more accessible to our members for umpiring, coaching as well as registering. The access to computers at the clubhouse should enable us to upload coaching

drills, team plays and more information on dieting and fitness. It is my belief that we should be able to try and provide our members with much as information to help educate and assistant members to improve our great game.

We also again this year held our Satellite Coaching Program which Ashley Hinton and I reintroduced two years ago. Due to time and availability of resources I had to look at restructuring how the program was conducted. I thank Graeme Pittman for his assistance in running the first part of the program which was a half hour "boot camp". The next hour consisted of skill and drills focusing on the core and basic skills. This program ran up until Christmas.

The program recommenced in the new year. A huge thank you to James Berkefeld for taking time out in his extremely busy schedule to come up from Sydney to conduct a 6 week Junior Training Development Camp. The groups were split into two groups, 12 -13 and 14 -18 ages. The first group was from 8am to 10am and the second group 10am to 12pm. In our discussions on how we would operate the development camp we caped the size of each group tot 20 to 25 per group. Although we never got that many at the camps we were very happy and impressed with the numbers of participants and the attitude displayed by all who attended the camp. A special mention must go to Scott Harry for being there every week and covering me for the times I couldn't make it due to me having to work every second week.

With the success of this Pre Season Development Camp I have already contacted James and organized with him to conduct the camps again next year. I believe that all Association Representative Team Coaches must take part in the camp to be involved with the age group of players in the team that they will be coaching, This has the benefit of also providing more assistance which in turn means that more juniors can be involved in the camps.

After attending a couple of state championships this season, playing under James as a coach as well as being member of a side playing in the Premier League in Newcastle, the style of hockey that many of our teams are playing is obsolete .After speaking with James we will also look at providing the opportunity for our coaches to update their knowledge in the correct training methods, techniques, terminology etc.

Timetable/ outline for Development Camps;

- 1. Sunday the 2nd of February to the 9th of March 2014 the development camps will be conducted.
- 2. 2 groups (12-14 & 15-18), with, at this stage, being caped at 20per group with first in best dressed. (Goalkeepers are more them welcome, with specific keeping drills to develop keeping techniques)
- 3. 12 14 will run 8am to 10am
- 4. 15 -18 will run 10am to 12pm

- 5. Saturday the 15th of February 2014 Coach the Coaches will commence.
- 6. Coaches will attend each coaching sessions beginning on Sunday the 16th of Feb until the completion of the program.

A training camp was held in the June/July school holidays in conjunction with the Hunter Academy. Approximately 60 juniors attended this day. The intention in holding the camp was for players to get a insight into the skill level and fitness level required by them if they wish to attend trials for the Hunter Academy 2013/14 season. We all should be very impressed with and acknowledge the great attitude shown by all the juniors that attended, it was very pleasing and I thank them all.

On the back of a hugely successful Representative Season by Manning Valley Juniors, and after speaking with Ben Ferguson, we organized a special skills camp. This included drag flicking, plenty corner trapping, corner pull outs, dynamic drags, overheads, rip ramps and 3D skills.(many even from my generation don't posses these skills). Ben along with Blake Hinton took 8 of our more elite players and demonstrated and and taught them these skills. Thank you to the boys for their efforts.

This season saw MVHA introduce an award, the "Association Coach Of The Year". The award was presented to two recipients Mr Steve Parvin and Gavin Boyd. Congratulations to both of them for their time and effort and hard work they both put in this season.

As I stated in my Chairperson report for the Men's Subcommittee, that like I, like Frank Birkefeld, would by lying if I had said that I had not lost passion for coaching after the passing of Alan Steele. Alan gave me my first job selling hockey sticks for him and encouraged me to be involved in coaching. However since taking on position of Coaching Director and working with our juniors it has been pleasing to have been able to observe the effort and hard work that they have put in to achieve their goals. I thank them for allowing me to help them and be part of each of their journeys. I get great joy when I see one of our junior players achieve success.

I believe that what Ash and I started two years ago has been long hard road but the cost to me personally as been all worth it. In finishing my strongest belief is that with our great facilities we need to plan for the future in a number of areas.

- 1. Junior develop is something that we should always focus on and the plans that are in place at this time are working. The proposed employment of a Development Officer is an awesome opportunity for Manning Valley Hockey and the development of the game in general on the Mid North Coast.
- 2. Foster and Gloucester are areas of opportunity that we should be looking at for growth. Especially Gloucester with the reform proposed by Hockey NSW to be completed in 2015.
- 3. Hockey in 2014 is harder, faster, structured, with high level of skill that is designed to produces goals. To do this I would like all our Representative Team Coaches to have a meeting after the junior AGM to discuss with the Junior Coaching Committee to plan on building our own brand of hockey.

- All first grade Cricket is played on turf wickets (best surfaces) and in cricket second and third grade play on synthetic wickets, pay the same and know that the first grade should get the best to showcase the top skills.
 - Group 3 league, first grade plays at the best time for spectators viewing, so the juniors can watch the elite players warm up, play and the more viewing the beat matches, more food and drink is consumed which means more revenue which in turn helps the MVHA get fees down, so more people can continue to play.
 - The appointment of a Development Officer is a must if we are to compete with other sports and to go into schools to promote the game.. To have someone that is full time in that role will help take pressure of individuals and clubs as many of our members do not have the time due to other commitments such as work. .

In closing, I would like to congratulate and thank everyone involved with any role they may have in Manning Valley Hockey this season. I especially congratulate those who represented at highest levels. I feel that the work done through the Association Development Camps has contributed to their successes with the number of our juniors that made State sides and squads. 

Hockey NSW reforms that have been imposed on us has meant that we our association and Gloucester Hockey Association were required to amalgamate in 2015. As a result we have been consulting with each other so that it will be an amalgamation that is of benefit to both our associations. This amalgamation has required a change in our constitution to allow for representation of Gloucester Hockey on the Associations Board of Management. The Hockey Reform has also enforced many changes in the areas of governance, participation and development .We have been most fortunate that our members have been able to work together to overcome the challenges before us.

I would like to congratulate those teams that made it through the grand finals. The visit from the Hockeyroo's Captain Madonna Blyth and 2RE broadcasting at the clubhouse I feel was a great addition to the Grand Final Program and helped to lift our profile in the community.

2014 Umpire Director's Report

Rules for the 2014 season remained unchanged with Manning Association continuing to include the 'Breaking Rule in their season. A summary of the season is as follows:-

- 1. Directions to Umpires for 2014 distributed to all clubs
- 2. Umpire Briefing Notes from Hockey Australia distributed to all clubs
- 3. The Dress Code for Umpires did improve this season with most conforming to the FLURO shirt and black trousers, skirt, shorts and suitable footwear. Clubs are to supply their umpires with FLURO shirts or obtain from clubhouse.

The onus is on clubs to ensure their umpires are attired correctly or they may face a fine.

- 4. Wet weather jackets and pants were purchased for the use of umpires.
- 5. The deadline for Accreditation is 2015 so all were reminded of this.
- 6. Lists of Umpires with their status/levels commenced for Men's, Women, and Juniors. However these were far from complete and needs to be updated for the 2015 season.
- 7. Reimbursement for travel for umpires to remain at \$20, Junior games \$10. Suggestion put forward that a Level 1 umpire receive \$30, Community \$20.
- 8. The MVHA Judiciary Procedures that were adopted in November 2011, have now been included in the Official Document for all Sub Committees to follow.
- 9. Assessment for umpires for their Community Badge was offered at the Men's Masters State Tournament in April 2013. Umpires from MVHA were asked to Umpire at these Championships.
- 10. During the season there were 2 Investigative Hearings. Thanks to members of the panels for their time and expertise in dealing with these.
- 11. A list of Technical Duties was completed for use with all sub Committees. Copies were made available to all and included in the Computer Scoreboard box.
- 12. Local Umpires for the Grand Final series were reimbursed \$20.



Points of Concern.

These areas are still causing concern so we hope to improve on these in the coming season.

- 1. Clubs must be responsible for supplying QUALITY umpires for the games
- Concern expressed about the number of games that some umpires are doing in a round. This needs to be monitored more closely 2. by Sub Committees and Clubs
- Concern over the quality of umpiring or performance of an umpire is to be brought before the club supplying the umpire. 3.
- Umpires are again reminded to not tolerate inappropriate behaviour, offensive language and abuse to umpires. A consistent and 4. assertive approach is necessary to eliminate this from our game.

Thanks to Dylan Turner and Ray Walters and their band of helpers who ran Umpire seminars during the season.

Attributes of Umpiring Include-

* being proactive and communicating with co-umpire, be mobile,

* be correctly attired and be more diligent on deliberate fouls and use appropriate penalties.

Many thanks to all those who dedicated their services to the teams throughout the season as umpires and for the commitment they showed in their weekly duties.

I would like to congratulate to BOM for the organization in supplying and appointing Umpires outside our competition for the duty of officiating at the Grand Final games for Div 1 and 2 Men and Women.

Again, this move proved to be very rewarding for all to see and experience such quality and demonstrate to all how umpires work together and handle games so efficiently without dissent.

The Umpire Of The Year Award for 2013 went a very deserving Ray Walters, while Jordyn Greenaway received an Encouragement Award.

Congratulations to these two worthy recipients.

However, the really outstanding aspect of the junior meetings was the positive and open attitude of those who attended. This enabled a very positive environment at all meetings and therefore much better outcomes were achieved.

Adam Johnson and Dom Tag Hook in2 Hockey – A huge thank you to Adam and Dom and their band of helpers where co-ordinated and conducted our Minkey program throughout the season. The numbers of young players grew quickly because of the work, support and encouragement shown by Adam, Dom and their helpers and we certainly will reap the benefits of this hard work in years to come. Thank you very much for the many hours you gave to our newest players and positive and fun manner in which you conducted the program.

During the season a survey was undertaken to gain important information, feedback and direction from our stakeholders involved and/or interested in Manning Valley junior hockey.

The feedback from this survey assisted the Junior Development Committees focus when looking at the Junior Playing Rules. It also vital information utilised at a meeting convened in September and attended by the Chairpersons, Secretaries and nominated delegates from all junior clubs. At this forum the following outcomes were agreed on in principal (*subject to formal acceptance at a junior sub Committee meeting*) and will support some important changes for the 2015 junior season.

- The Manning Valley Junior Hockey to conduct a pre season competition commencing in March.
- The junior competition to end and hold its grand final on the final round of the regular senior competition. (*This is to support the amount of juniors playing senior hockey, while also considering the demands of other stakeholders involved in the game.*)
- The under 7's and under 9s competitions to end on the final round of the regular junior competition
- The Under 11's competition to continue in its current *Stick2Hockey* format however with a reduced number of field players. (*Refer to draft playing rules*)
- The junior competition to have playing rounds on the first and third Saturdays of the April and June School holidays.
- A reduced number of junior playing rounds held on Sundays, however more rounds may be scheduled through the week (replacing training and also played at 5.30pm on other days) to cover periods lost to bad weather, championship carnivals etc.
- An expanded Manning Valley Junior Hockey sub Committee in 2015.

As you can see above, there are some serious changes being considered in our junior game and this is about providing an environment that increases participation for players across all junior competitions and making decisions that reflect a more professional and positive, fun and successful environment for all junior hockey stakeholders. I personally support all the recommendations outlined above and believe they have been considered and well accepted considerations.

In closing I would like thank everyone in the junior hockey environment for making what has been a lot of hard work also a lot of enjoyable experiences also. I would like to think that I am leaving Manning Valley Junior Hockey in a stronger position than when I commenced as chairperson however that will be for others to decide. I took the role on and quickly realised that that there many areas where we lack the required professionalism and a consistent and transparent decision making process, necessary to develop our game further and throughout the season I believe we addressed many of these key areas. If the next committee can continue to develop procedures and communications in these areas then I believe all junior hockey participants will continue to enjoy a unified, supportive, positive and successful environment and will only lead to greater participation from players, parents, clubs and importantly dedicated volunteers.

I would particularly like to again thank the Manning Valley Board and Craig Colvin for his support of Manning Valley Junior Hockey. Craig has worked more hours than any other person to support the development and growth of junior hockey and his contribution was deservedly recognised with his Junior Promotions and Development award.

History of Field Hockey

The sport of field hockey — or just "hockey," as it's known in most of the 112 countries it is played — is widely considered one of the top six sports in the world. Field Hockey's origins are ancient. Proof can be found in the simplicity of the game: Teams use a stick to hit a ball into a goal.

Ancient Field Hockey

The exact origins of the sport are unknown. However, archeologists found 4,000-year-old drawings of men playing a simplistic version of the game in the Beni Hasan tombs in the Nile Valley, Egypt. Other historical records show that various versions of the sport were played in the Persian, Roman, Ethiopian, and Aztec civilizations.

The Middle Ages

A new era was defined in the Middle Ages, when variations of hockey-like games began popping up in various European countries. The game of "cambuca" was played in England, while "shinty" was played in Scotland, "jeu de mail" was played in France, and "het kolven" was played in the Netherlands.

English Royalty

The sport became popular among English Royalty in the 1300s. Yet, not all of the royals were fond of the game. In 1363, King Edward III of England issued the proclamation: "Moreover, we ordain that you prohibit under penalty of imprisonment all and sundry from such stone, wood and iron throwing; handball, football, or hockey; coursing and cock-fighting, or other such idle games." This proclamation is proof that a semi-organized version of hockey was being played over 1,500 years ago. Modern Hockey

In the mid – 19th century, English public schools adopted the modern game of field hockey. Playing a much rougher version of the game, the first hockey club, Blackheath, was formed in 1849. A few decades later, the Middlesex cricket clubs developed the modern game. A club called "Teddington" was especially known for its part in molding the game. The cricket players were looking for something to play during winter and began drawing up rules for their new game. This led to the first field hockey association: Hockey Association in London, established in 1886.

Olympic Field Hockey

The British Army had spread the game throughout the British Empire. In 1895, field hockey had its first international competition. The game was between Ireland and Wales. Ireland won, 3-0. Hockey first appeared in the 1908 Olympic Games in London with only three teams: England, Ireland, and Scotland. The sport was permanently adopted into the Olympics at the 1928 Olympic Games in Amsterdam. Women's field hockey made its debut and became an Olympic fixture at the 1980 Summer Games in Moscow, Russia. International Body is Formed



International structuring for the sport in Europe began when England and Belgium agreed to play against each other. These countries would later join the French federation in 1924 to create the International Hockey Federation (or the FIH, standing for "Fédération International de Hockey" in French). To this day, the FIH is the sport's international governing body. The original members were Austria, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, France, Hungary, Spain, and Switzerland. The FIH now consists of 112 member associations, spread across five continents.

Women in Field Hockey

Field hockey was originally considered too dangerous a sport for female participants. This notion later changed when women who enjoyed outdoor activities, such as croquette and lawn tennis, adopted field hockey as a socially acceptable outdoor activity. It was later considered as the only team sport proper for women.

Women's field hockey was first introduced to British Universities and schools in the 1880s. The first field hockey club, Molesey Ladies Hockey Club, was founded in 1887. This club led to the formation of the International Federation of Women's Hockey Associations (IFWHA) in 1927. Following the establishment of this association, women's field hockey grew rapidly around the world. It spread in many continental European countries and later to the USA.

India was introduced to field hockey in 1885 by British servicemen. Within ten years, the country was hosting the Beighton Cup and the Aga Khan tournament. India entered the Olympic Games in 1928 and the men's team won all five of its games

without giving up a single goal. The men's team then went on to win the gold medal in every Olympics from 1932 until 1956, and then again in 1964 and 1980. Pakistan won gold in 1960, 1968, and 1984.

Field hockey is the national sport of India, a country that owns eight Olympic gold medals in men's competition. India leads the Olympics with the highest number of field hockey gold medals among all national teams.

Synthetic Turf

Field hockey was originally played on grass surfaces. That changed in the 1970s, when artificial turf became a replacement on many fields. The game has changed significantly with this innovation.

The Indian dribble is one of the many new tactics and techniques used for the faster field.

Also, since the application of turf, Indian and Pakistani domination ended. Wealthier European countries have since dominated the Olympics. Synthetic fields are now mandatory for all national and international tournaments. Gender Disparities

Field Hockey is continually growing in popularity throughout the world. In most countries there is an even balance between men and women who play the sport. In the United States, however, it is predominantly a female sport.
